GPS Old Boys Brief History

GPS Old Boys Rugby Club is the successor in name to the Past Grammar School Football Club and it is the oldest surviving Rugby Club in Queensland and one of the oldest Rugby Clubs in Australia. The Club was officially formed in 1887 and consisted of a combination of both past and present Brisbane Grammar School players although a number of them represented Queensland as Past Grammar players in 1885 and 1886.

In 1889 the Past Grammar School Football Club was established as a separate identity distinct from the old side with its mix of past and present players. The formation of the Club was formalised at a meeting held at the Treasury Hotel in Brisbane on the 5th March 1891 and Mr. R.H. Roe, the Headmaster of Brisbane Grammar School was elected as President. Sir Charles Lilley and Sir Samuel Griffith, among others, were elected as Vice Presidents. It was decided that the Club colours would be red and white. Rugby was not played in Queensland from 1916 until reintroduced in 1928 at which time the BGS Old Boys' Rugby Union Football Club again took its place in the Brisbane competition.

In 1930 the constitution of the Club was changed to allow past students from the other GPS schools to become members and although the name was retained that year it was later changed to GPS Old Boys' Rugby Club and it played under that name for the first time in the 1931 season and has continued to be known and play under that name to the present day in the recognised blue and green jerseys. The constitution was again changed some years later and membership of the club is now unrestricted.

Forty-six of the Club's members have played for Australia and one hundred and ninety-two have played for Queensland. Seven have captained Australian senior teams, two the Australian sevens team and one has represented and captained England and another Scotland. In all nine former members have played international football whilst playing with other clubs.

In more recent times the overall strength of the Club has been reflected in the results of the Doughty Shield Club Championship competition: - 2006 – first, 2007 – second, 2008 – first, 2009 – second, 2010 – third, and in the number of teams fielded in Brisbane competitions: - eleven in 2008, and twelve in 2009. In 2010 Jeeps fielded eleven teams and won five premierships. Two teams were Runners Up and another two were finalists.

President's Report

It is my privilege to present for your consideration the 2010 season Annual Report of the GPS Old Boys Rugby Club.

On the 1st January 1973, "The Gallopers Gazette" which was at that time the Jeeps Club magazine reported, "the 1972 season will be long remembered as probably the most successful the GPS Club has ever had." These words can now be applied to the 2010 season which saw out of eleven teams five (2nd Grade, 4th Grade, Wyatt Cup, Premier Colts) win Premierships, two finish as Runners Up (1st Grade, Colts 1 Colts 2), two play in the finals series(3rd Grade, Scotney Cup) and only two teams unplaced (Premier Grade, Normanby Cup). A truly magnificent achievement.

In 1972 four teams made the Grand Finals with 1st Grade and 4th Grade winning Premierships and 2nd Grade and 3rd Grade taking the Runners Up flags whilst both the Under 19 and Under 18 sides made the Finals. It has taken Jeeps a long time to better that performance, which it could be argued was perhaps not as good as the 2008 results which saw one premiership from six Grand Final appearances but it not arguable that there is a new found maturity amongst the playing ranks and the way our players have approached their football in 2010. This attitudinal change has resulted in teams winning games which previously would have been lost. Our players, nearly all of whom would have played at some stage in teams that ultimately won premierships, have brought great credit to themselves and the Club and I congratulate them on their season performances as I do their coaches, managers and support staff whose unselfish and generous donation of time and effort contributed in no small way to the season's success.

I made reference to the 1972 season for a particular reason. Whilst it is of passing interest to consider the results of that year it is important to reflect where we are as a Club all these years later. We have facilities at Ashgrove that are second to none in Brisbane club football, we have enough players to support an eleven team season campaign, we have players of quality who took us to a level of unprecedented success but what we still don't have as we didn't in 1973 is the level of financial security and independence which is necessary for economic survival. Notwithstanding all the work that is put in by your Committee, particularly Marty Silec and Danny Nugent and their "Dawnbusters", and others to make home games and supporting fund raising activities, including the GPS Ball which was the first held for many years and should be a must on the calendar, enjoyable and financially successful we continue to struggle financially. Even though the Club takes every opportunity to raise funds during the season, Jeeps like every other Club is still dependent on the Premier funding which makes its way from the ARU through the QRU to the Club. It was reduced by the QRU in 2010 and the reduced level will be maintained in 2011. It was bad timing for Jeeps as there was and still is an outstanding liability for the cost of the grounds refurbishment which had been undertaken with our Ashgrove partners Ashgrove GPS and Valleys Cricket Club.

We all need to support Jeeps financially in any way we can. It is no longer good enough to say you are a Jeeps man, a Jeeps member or a Jeeps supporter if you are not a financial member of or a donor to the Club you call your own. Rob Melloy has worked extremely hard since volunteering his services to update and upgrade the Club's database to the point where we are now able to communicate often and quickly with our members and supporters. Rob has been responsible for raising our paid membership and the number of donors to unprecedented levels. He is also primarily responsible for formatting and compiling our Annual Reports and his contribution in this area and his assistance to me has allowed and continues to allow the Club to present its members and supporters with a truly informative and now significant historical document which is also available online. I extend my gratitude to him for his valuable and ongoing work. He has worked tirelessly in tandem with Rod Torkington who continues to provide unfailing support to both your Committee and I. Jeeps has been and is lucky to have his services and hopefully he will continue to offer them for a little while longer yet.

A significant change was made to the way the canteen operated in 2010. A joint Venture operation was conducted with Ashgrove GPS and whilst there remains a little fine tuning to be done the initiative can be hailed as an unqualified success and is a further example of what can be achieved when two Clubs combine their resources and work together. My Committee and I extend our thanks to Col White, the President of Ashgrove GPS and his Committee who continue to foster the spirit of co-operation.

The thanks of the whole of the membership of Jeeps is offered to Lorraine Gorman, her family and willing band of helpers. Lorraine has announced her retirement but has guaranteed that there will be no problems with succession with Donna to take over from her next year. Thank you Lorraine we could not have done without you. Queensland Premier Rugby Competition

After a promising start to the home and away rounds, in which good wins were achieved over last year's grand finalists, Souths and Brothers, in rounds one and two, injuries and some poor performances resulted in only 3 wins and 6 losses by the half way mark in season 2010. Tellingly, there were 32 players who started in one or more of the 9 rounds to this stage of the season. In total, 37 players started in one or more rounds of the full season and a further 9 players made appearances off the reserves bench. Mathew Garland was the only player to start in all 18 rounds.

The second half of the season saw more stability in the starting line-up and enabled us to demonstrate the talent and skills that were foreshadowed in 2009. However, as a group, we again failed to reach our significant potential in 2010.

This was due to his absence from round 3 until round 11, inclusive, preparing for and representing Fiji in the Under 20's Rugby World Cup. He also missed one round through injury. It should also be pointed out that both Mathew and Chris were eligible to play Colts this year and Mathew celebrated his 18th birthday during the season. Augurs pretty well for the future of our great club!

As would be expected, it wasn't all doom and gloom. Highlights were the two wins over Premiers Brothers, particularly the gutsy away win (21-15) that kick started our resurgence in the second half of the season. Home wins over Sunnybank(24-22) and Gold Coast (52-13) and the away win against Easts (39-23), all in the second half of the season, were also very satisfying. These wins underlined what might have been if we hadn't left our run until the second half of the season.

Although we were still an outside chance of making the finals when we ran out against Sunshine Coast in the final round at home, unfortunately, our opponents had more desire than we did on the day and we couldn't secure the bonus point win that we were chasing. As it turned out, even if we had won that match, we wouldn't have qualified as other games didn't go the way we needed.

Jono Ellis was the season's Best & Fairest player. He was a model of consistency and will be a stalwart at Jeeps for many years to come. Josh Logan was most improved and best back. He plays well above his weight and his versatility was outstanding. Congratulations to both!

It would be remiss of me not to pay tribute to several players who have retired or possibly played their last game for Jeeps. Steve Miller, Donovan Slade, Elia Tuqiri, Ryan McDonald and Geoff Ingram have all given long and meritorious service to our Club and we sincerely thank them and wish them well for the future.

Finally, thank you to my fellow coaching and management staff, to the many players who ran out for Premier Grade and to all who helped or supported the Premier Grade group in any way during 2010.

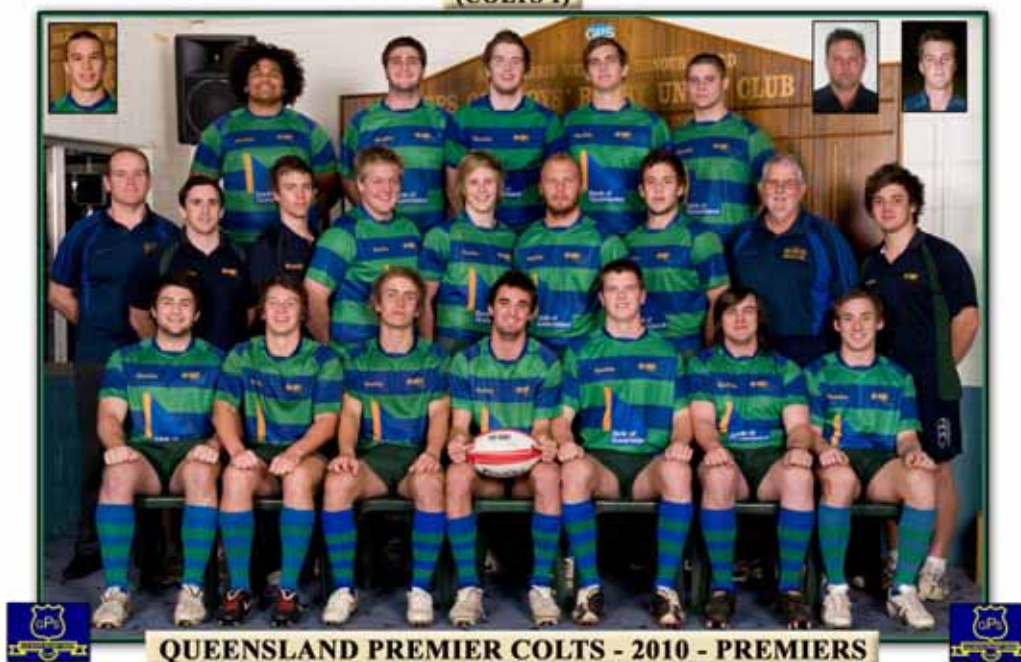

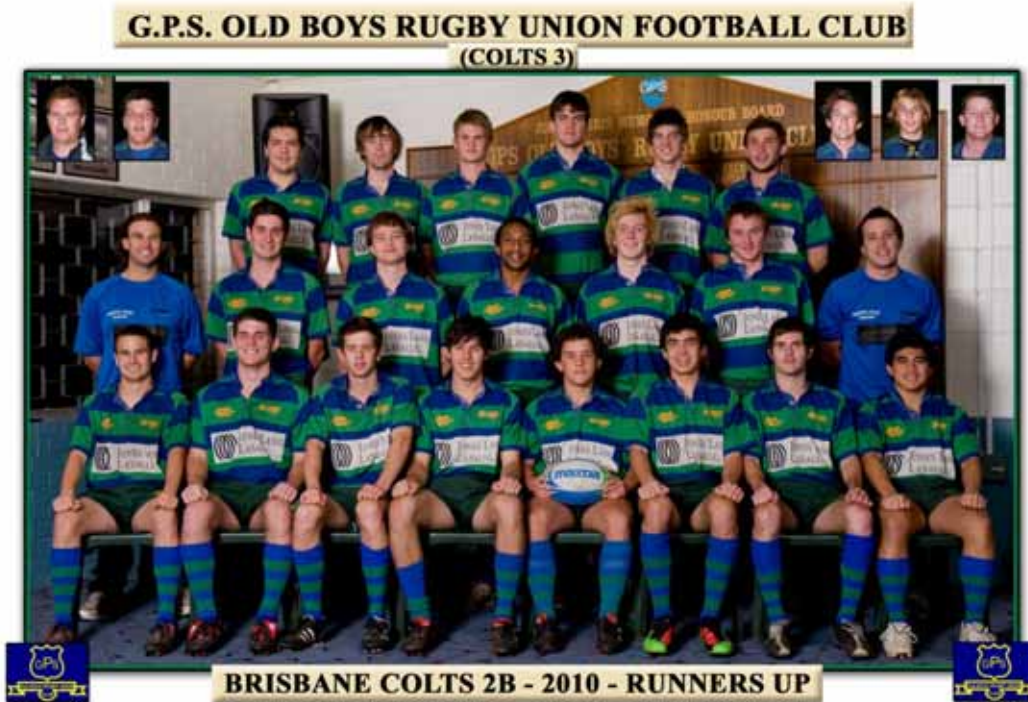

Treasurer's Report

Despite the Club's significant on field successes, 2010 proved to be financially challenging. The year began with a significant working capital shortfall due to overruns from the now complete ground redevelopment project. Medium term funding has been secured to cover that liquidity shortfall. However, our cash-flow problems were exacerbated when the QRU announced that Premier Club grants would be reduced from \$80,000 p.a. to \$50,000 p.a. with immediate effect.

The 2010 financial year produced a **trading loss** of **\$ 33,472** (including the non-cash depreciation expense of \$ 43,954).

An overview of club operations indicates that we need to increase player subscriptions. There is now a significant shortfall in revenue generated from player fees and QRU Premier Club grants which we combine to finance those costs which are directly related to putting teams on the field. The out-going committee has recommended increased 2011 subscription fees and it is likely a similar increase in subscriptions will be necessary in 2012. An alternative could be to introduce a more specific user – pays system for various aspects of rugby playing, but the Committee is not attracted to that option for a number of reasons, both practical and philosophical.

Despite the work of many, we have struggled to produce a worthy return from our major functions. Whilst it's difficult to record precise outcomes due to allocation of sponsor product and related arrangements, the combined yield from sponsorship and major functions shows a declining trend that we will need to arrest to remain financially viable. A notable exception has been field marquee hire which proved popular in 2010. Similarly, the rejuvenated golf day and trivia night produced useful returns.

Also on the plus side, a pre-season agreement with Ashgrove GPS Juniors to share Canteen operations significantly streamlined canteen administration for our hard-working personnel. Preliminary figures suggest the concept has been worthwhile, and over time we hope to build on this closer working relationship with the junior club.

We are of course, significantly indebted to all our sponsors without whom the Club could not function in its current format.

Past players and club members increased their financial support during 2010 and we both appreciated and needed all of the \$14,492 raised in 2010 from member subscriptions and donations.

We are conscious of the broader ramifications of the QRU's financial position, but your committee is hopeful that Premier Club funding can at least be maintained at 2010 levels. The grant reduction in 2010 proved challenging. Any further reduction in grant funding would represent a major set-back, particularly as the planned later start to the 2011 grade season will delay receipt of player subscriptions and match day revenue. The period up to April 2011 will again be very tight. Early remittance of player and member subscriptions would assist greatly.

Ironically, the ground redevelopment project has contributed to significantly increased ground maintenance obligations including field aeration and power costs. Our co-tenants share that burden with us but the extra costs add to the revenue base that must be secured each year simply to stay in the game.

The club has been fortunate to possess a broad and loyal supporter base who have been willing to participate in club initiatives as evidenced by the financial support from members this year. Our updated ground facilities also mean we can offer contemporary standard playing conditions to our player base. Our coaching and management team were successful in 2010. Hopefully our network of people and our facilities will stand us in good stead to meet future challenges.




The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.
