GPS Rugby Brief History

GPS Rugby is the successor in name to GPS Old Boys Rugby Club and to the Past Grammar School Football Club and it is the oldest surviving Rugby Club in Queensland and alsoone of the oldest Rugby Clubs in Australia. The Club was officially formed in 1887 and consisted of a combination of both past and present Brisbane Grammar School players although a number of them represented Queensland as Past Grammar players in 1885 and 1886.

In 1889 the Past Grammar School Football Club was established as a separate identity distinct from the old side with its mix of past and present players. The Club was formalised at a meeting held on the 5th March 1891 and Mr. R.H. Roe, the Headmaster of Brisbane Grammar School was elected as President. Sir Charles Lilley and Sir Samuel Griffith, among others, were elected as Vice Presidents. It was decided that the Club colours would be red and white. Rugby was not played in Queensland from 1916 until reintroduced in 1928 when, under a new name, the BGS Old Boys' Rugby Union Football Club again took its place in the Brisbane competition.

In 1930 the constitution of the Club was changed to allow past students from the other GPS schools to become members and although the name was retained that year it was later changed to GPS Old Boys' Rugby Club and it played in green and blue colours for the first time in the 1931 season. Later the constitution was again changed and membership of the club made unrestricted.

Fifty of the Club's members have played for Australia and over 200 have played for Queensland. Seven have captained Australian senior teams, two the Australian sevens team and one has represented and captained England and another Scotland.

Ashgrove GPS Junior Rugby Club was formed from the Ashgrove Emus Club in 1984 when it affiliated with GPS Old Boys after that club moved from Finsbury Park to Ashgrove Sports Ground. It quickly grew to be the largest Junior Club in Brisbane winning the QJRU President's trophy for the most successful club on a number of occasions.

In 2014 GPS Old Boys Rugby Club amalgamated with Ashgrove GPS Junior Rugby Club to form GPS Rugby Club making it the largest club in Australia with almost 1500 players. In 2018 the Amalgamated club won its first premiership.

A very special thanks to Anthony Herbert our CEO who puts in an enormous amount of time and effort to see the club excel and continues to improve the experience at the club. Martin Southwood – operations manager, Lauren Urquhart – Office Manager and Elwee Prinsloo – Director of Rugby have all put in a massive effort in 2018.

Facilities

Field 1 Lighting replacement was completed at a cost of \$330,000. This project was completed with the help of the BCC \$100,000 - Steven Toomey, \$120,000 Federal Government Funding - Trevor Evans, \$70,000 State Government – Kate Jones with ourselves and Valleys contributing to the balance.

As I touched on when we released the Concept Master Plan for the Ashgrove Sport Ground in June, I am pleased to report that in the last two months we have had very positive meetings with Trevor Evans our local Federal Member and Kate Jones our local State Member. Both Trevor and Kate looked very favourably on the plans and have taken away to consult with their respective government departments. Brisbane City Council is also assisting further in the development of the concept plans. We need government funding commitment prior to advancing. Your urging our local members for support would assist greatly.

In past years the idea of establishing a Foundation has been discussed. I am pleased to advise that In line with the future development of the club, a formal foundation has been established which will enable tax deductible donations to be made. Below is the link to the foundation page.

Community

The club has a history of contributing back to the community. In 2018 we continued through our Charity Day to raise funds for Ronald McDonald house who help families of hospitalised children. We also took the opportunity of our last home game in conjunction with our Major Sponsor **Height for Hire** to raise funds for Drought Relief for those hardest hit in our farming community.

Events and Functions

The club held numerous and well attended functions during the year. The year commenced with the reintroduction of the Annual Golf Day. Rugby Report

2018 saw GPS competing with 11 senior teams from which 9 teams made the finals series and 2 teams ending up premiers in their respective competitions. Fair to say that this was improvement on previous seasons, but we also understand that we have by no means fulfilled our true potential as a club just yet.

The highlights of the season certainly included ladies playing in their 1st ever grand final as well as 1st grade winning the premiership for the first time since 1996.

Off & Pre-season

A group of 60+ players that consisted of both grades and colts' players started their off-season program early in November 2017. The program was a massive shift in our previous approach and included a variety of off site conditioning, skills and team building activities. These activities were great to set an early base of expectations and create an environment where players could improve in their skills, physical and mental conditioning.

After a tough pre-Christmas block the boys had a two week break and commenced preseason early in January. The focus now shifted to a club culture and specific skill development with ladies joining the men in conditioning and coaches running specific positional and mini unit skills before each session. We had a staggering 130+ players from the outset so coaches were really challenged to manage and deliver quality across a group this big. The early season boom led to over 300 registrations for the 2018 season but also started a very healthy and all-inclusive club culture.

In season

We had a massive number of volunteers, coaches and managers looking after the group in terms of new registration processes, medicals, logistics and general rugby development. Without the efforts of these people involved none of our progress or success would be possible as a club.

It was very pleasing to see how our management staff focussed on solutions and overcame several challenges in a variety of areas as the season progressed. This was a big contributor to the end of season finals series in terms of number of teams competing. A special thank you to Herbie, Lauren and Rob's efforts behind the scenes.

Finals series

Although we had 9 teams in the playoffs we were very clear in improvements still needed after only 2 teams went on to win their grades. This is certainly a massive focus point for the next season in terms of getting to finals but also ensuring we are more successful in the outcome of this series.

Recruitment and development

2018 saw a few new faces joining Jeeps from not only overseas but also a number of players making the shift to Yoku road from other clubs. Notable recruits included Jaye Thompson, Isaac Cavu, Alfonso Hormia, Albert Nikoro, Davis Tavita, Matt Gicquel and Jordan Lenac.

It was also very pleasing seeing the number of younger players making their debuts for 1st grade. Jed Chapman, Tom Kibble, Isaac De Flavis and Josh Collins were all part of this special group.

Sevens and post season activities

2018 7's season promises to be more exiting than ever before with the introduction of a Premier 7's competition. GPS will run an elite 7's program for a squad of 24 players but also include a women's and social teams for the Noosa tournament. We also wish our 8 NRC players the best for their 2018 campaigns.

This period will allow us to focus on 3 key components: Development; Performance and Recruitment

Academy and Juniors

We decided to review the academy program from 2017 and put in place plans for a better more sustainable program that ensures more consistent success or return through to our senior teams. We are delighted to announce a new and improved program with the 1st club in Brisbane offering a full-time program for players that aspire to develop to the higher levels of the game. The program includes:

- Certificate 3 and 4 in Personal training
- Coaching and referee accreditation
- Specialist rugby development
- Individualised strength and conditioning
- Project management
- Nutrition and supplementation
- Life skills and mental health

Junior development was a key focus area for the club in 2018. The emphasis was to be more on the quality of coaching to ensure better session delivery to the players. Some key developments included:

- Premier grade shadow/ mentor program (junior coaches being part of Premier grade preparations in terms of preview, review, sessions and game day operations)
- Specific game component clinics (Attacking and defensive contact, tackle clinics) presented by the QRU, DOR and senior players
- Integration of our senior playing group to our juniors (players assisted in age group coaching on several occasions throughout the year)
- 1 on 1 development with DOR (assisting some coaches with planning, session delivery and reviewing)

Looking forward to 2019

The last 2 seasons have allowed a solid platform for us at Jeeps to really accelerate and excel in our development as a club to bring more sustainable success. The importance of staying development focussed, and performance driven has brought our attention to some key areas of improvement for 2019

- 1. Better coaching = better players
- 2. Bridging the gap (transition between junior to seniors)
- 3. Skill development over winning in juniors
- 4. Build on our history, traditions and who we are as people and as a club
- 5. Winning

The 7's team played against a number of GPS teams including Under 16, Under 15 Blue, GPS Ladies and a team from Enoggera Army Barracks. The season concluded with players running on the premier team and playing at half time during the charity round.

Moving towards the 2019 season the Gallopers Program would like to increase player numbers by:

- Raising the profile of the program in the local community with an information flyer to schools and special schools.
- Increase awareness at the club level with year level coordinators spreading the inclusive rugby message to their families
- Setting up an information table on club registration days





Notes to the Financial Statements For the year ended 31 October 2018

Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act of Queensland. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

(b) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

(c) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

(d) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reasonably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

(e) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

Notes to the Financial Statements For the year ended 31 October 2018

(f) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(g) Leases

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the period in which they are incurred.

(h) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the assets and liabilities statement are shown inclusive of GST.

(i) Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period, which remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.
