### COMPETITION TEAMS

Teams were entered in three Grades - "A" Grade, "B" Reserve and "B" Grade.

### "A" GRADE

The "A" Grade Team performed quite well during the season and at the end of the Premiership Rounds finished in third position.

In a very close Semi Final the Team managed to defeat Souths by a single point and earn the right to meet the Christian Brothers Team who had lost the major Semi Final to Varsity. The boys rose nicely to the occasion and defeated the Brothers Team for the second time during the year to gain the coveted chance to win the Premiership. However, the Varsity Team proved too good and after an even first half we were eventually soundly defeated in a rather poor and rough game.

During the year we had our usual crop of injuries and of the "A" Grade, John Greene and Brian Loel were absent after being injured, for the greater part of the season. Bruce Mills too, after two head injuries requiring medical attention decided to retire from "A" Grade football and concentrate upon coaching at which he proved most successful.

Garth Jones too, sustained a very painful injury in the Second Test against Fiji in Sydney but resumed for the Semi Finals and Grand Final.

Other players too, sustained injuries which kept them from play for varying periods.

The "A" Grade Team was ably led by Club Captain, Peter Robinson.

The Club's most successful team who under the coaching of Dr. Con Primmer, the leadership of John Herbert, and the managership of Mark Williams succeeded in winning the Club its second Premiership since the War.

The two games v. Varsity, the major Semi Final and the Grand Final were both great games. The Grand Final proved very exciting as Varsity fought back from being down 21 - 3 to square the game at full-time. G.P.S. however, came right back during Extra Time and ran out good winners 34 - 21. Injuries in this Grade also affected the Team's strength. A. Flynn being out for the last round and finals and others for varying short periods.

Nick Horsley and Ken Hooper were absentees at the season's end due to educational and examination commitments.

### "B" GRADE

This team suffered more than others of the Club in so far as loss of player strength was concerned and were ably led by Bill Simson.

Rod Pegus became an early casualty with a broken leg (not a football injury). Bill Meurant, centre, was lost with a knee injury. P. Irwin broke his nose.

At vital times absentees, Ian Calquhoun to the Tongan Team, Don Gray to New Guinea and Alan Gilpin lost to the "A" Grade at the season's end materially weakened the side.

This team had it been able to maintain its strength all the season could easily have won a second Club Premiership.

They had the proud distinction of being the only team to defeat Teachers Training College, a very good team, during the season.

They easily earned a Semi Final place, but could not, with a weakened team succeed in the Finals.

Coaching was in the hands of Bruce Mills following his retirement from "A" Grade football.

### TRAINING

Teams trained on Mondays and Wednesdays at New Farm and lighting restrictions did not apply this season.

Attendances were better than in 1953 but Monday continues to be a bugbear to Coaches no doubt due to the continued Sunday play.
