Gentlemen,

Your executive has much pleasure in reporting upon the activities and highlights of the Club during the season recently concluded.

COMPETITION RESULTS

Overall results throughout the Club reflect the pattern which has been continuing for several years now. With the exception of premiers/minor premiers Fourth Grade most teams hovered about the middle of the competition. Some sterling efforts were put in by all teams. Wins were recorded against more highly fancied and placed teams and yet we succumbed to teams who are generally considered to be amongst those easier to beat. It seems we are motivated to put in greater efforts against stronger or allegedly stronger teams and content to relax and subsequently lose to lesser teams. This is a matter of attitude which must be overcome amongst all participants if the Club is to be successful in 1991. Also to our disadvantage was a lack of depth in certain key positions. Whilst this year we were not embarrassed by a shortage of players the Club appears to have taken on a middle aged configuration in that it is somewhat bottom heavy. A pleasing aspect of this season was the number of colts players who have come through into the Open grades. Many of these players, although in some places playing in lower grades this season have shown the ability, dedication and character to carry on to A Grade and higher honours. These players are to be encouraged. Congratulations to our Club Captain, Anthony Herbert who at last appears to have received due recognition from the National Selectors in his appointment to the Australian team. We wish him well for 1991 with the World Cup.

Fourth grade are to be particularly congratulated on defeating University to win the minor premiership and also defeating University to win the premiership—Bert Bickley trophy. This is the ninth time in 21 years Fourth grade have won the premiership. Well done Blair Barnhill and Mick Arnold—co-coaches and all the players who participated in Fourth grade during the season.

Our three under 19 teams again had good numbers and some very able players. This year also marked the debut of David Phillips and Jim Beirne coaching in Colts and we hope we will see more of these coaches and their players in the coming seasons. Colts once again ended up in about the middle of the pack whilst Two and Three ended up in fourth position. It was most pleasing to see some seven State representatives coming from the ranks of the Colts. I am sure in the coming season it would be of great assistance to Colts and their coaches if more supporters could attend the matches which are generally held on a Saturday during the season. As all of us know it is certainly a benefit to have supporters on the sidelines.

CLUBHOUSE/FIELDS

This season we have had full use of the main Clubhouse and also the facility acquired from the Ashgrove Rules Club. In respect of the latter facility our thanks are extended to Ashgrove GPS Juniors who have carried out considerable work on the building and surrounds, including painting and paving, which have considerably enhanced the useability of this area. Our thanks also to Local Alderman, Brian Hallinan who has arranged for the City Council to instal children's playground equipment in this area.

There are also moves to relocate the weight room and plans have been prepared for Council approval. Both fields were treated with more respect this season and finished up having a reasonable covering of grass and being in a satisfactory condition for play. Thanks to coaches and trainers who had the commonsense not to run on the fields when they were waterlogged and also to conduct aspects of training off the playing surfaces.

FINANCE

The report of the Treasurer, together with the accounts for the year will appear later in this report. You will note from the report the Club has considerable financial transactions. In regard to finances it warrants our considerable thanks to our Treasurer and those members and supporters, including ladies, who assist in raising funds. Our sincere thanks must also go to our major sponsors, Les Pullos from the Normanby Hotel (also the Hamilton, Alliance and 29 Murray Street) who this year saw fit to increase his sponsorship. To Mitsubishi who have also maintained their generous sponsorship of many years. A new sponsor this year has been Owen Edwards through his position with National Mutual and I am pleased to say that quite good funds have arisen from this sponsorship. In addition we have our regular minor sponsors, Brisbane Ice Sales, Crown Paint, Discovery Corner and others whose advertisements you will see in this publication. Our loan from Valleys in relation to the acquisition of 50% interest in the original facilities has been repaid in full and loans provided in respect of acquisition of the new facilities are being repaid.

In relation to subscriptions Frank Jensen has been most successful in collecting subscriptions from players this year and whilst there are the usual number of freeloaders, most players accept this responsibility. Subs do not cover the cost of a jersey and yet some people seem to feel that they can take a jersey as of right. This is once again a correction attitude needed to achieve a successful Club. Subs become due and payable on the date of the Annual General Meeting.

THANKS

The Club is indebted to a number of people and groups for the valued assistance throughout the year.

I have already mentioned our sponsors.

Coaches have put in many hours of hard and dedicated work this season and they are Paul Green, David Given, Chris Wake, Mick Arnold, Blair Barnhill, David Phillips and Jim Beirne.

This year we were fortunate in having two able and sensible selectors, something the Club has lacked for a number of years. Thanks to Alby Taylor and George Bickerstaff. Team Managers are also to be thanked, in particular Rod Torkington and Andrew Potts.

This year the Club was indeed fortunate to have the services of Roger Fitzgerald and Louise O'Connor as physiotherapists who have set up a practise as the Red Hill Physiotherapy and Sports Injury Centre. Although at times it seemed there were more people being treated by the physios than actually out training. Once again we had the services of Sean Quinn who has been with the Club for a number of years now assisting with fitness training and strapping. Sean has also completed the sports medicine course and if his talents are properly used will be of great value to the Club in the future.

Also assisting, particularly in the lower grades was our old friend, Bill Alvers without whose efforts as to fitness Fourth grade may have been hard pressed to win the grand final.

Roger Dent continues his excellent service on the bar. We have no ladies committee, however the Taylor mothers daughters, together with numerous girlfriends assisted greatly in this regard. However, for 1991 it would certainly be of great assistance if we were able to put a ladies committee together.

Alan Taylor, our immediate past president continued his great contribution to the Club, being available when advice was sought and also putting in many hours of physical work in many categories at the Club this year.

Our secretary, Gerry Herbert, has liaised with Valleys District Cricket Club secretary, Peter Easton and several meetings have been held by members of the respective clubs executives and we are indeed thankful for Valleys amicable co-operation and liaison.

Finally, thanks to our consistent supporters who have been with us for many seasons.

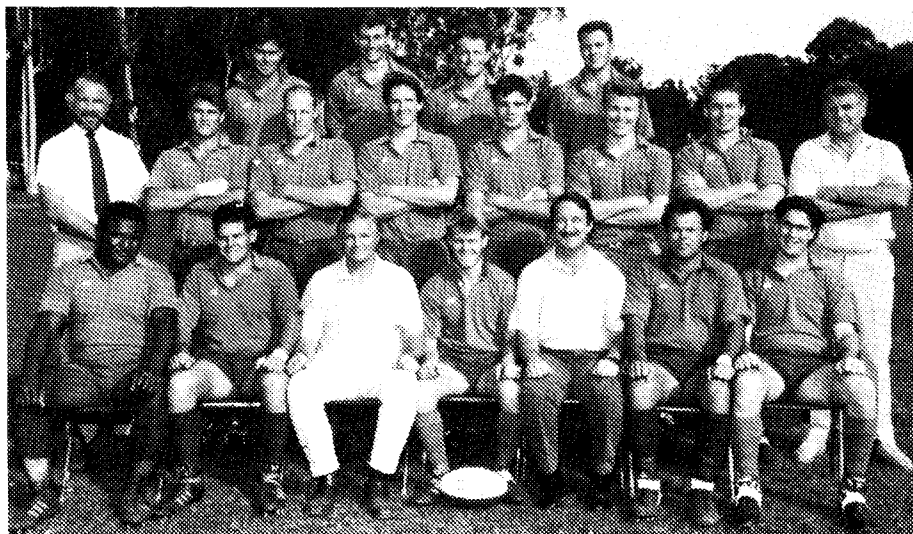
We have had excellent liaison with outgoing President Paul Reid and are sure that such liaison will continue with the new President, Rob Melloy and we congratulate him on his appointment.

A GRADE REPORT

The 1990 season had most of the ingredients of a good season of Rugby—some memorable victories, close losses, character building experiences, good touring, a horrendous injury toll and some signs that there is a growing resurgence of depth and spirit within the club that augurs well for 1991.

A Grade fortunes were mixed. We were once again undefeated in Winfield State Challenge matches—indeed each of the games against Uni, Redcliffe, Gold Coast and Darling Downs saw us come from behind to keep our unbeaten record intact.

We started the season with a very competitive team and recorded some impressive early season results including narrow losses to Souths and Easts—games in which we were clearly the better team. Injuries however started to place intolerable demands on our depth and results suffered accordingly. Every Club has injuries and I don't want to make a big issue of ours, but at a time in our history when we are rebuilding; losses such as Dan Powell, Mick Ware (who would have played Australian U21), Jason Jones, Aaron Booth, Doug McGibbon, Peter Nielsen and Neil Tobitt, to name but a few, proved more than our resources could reasonably cope with, particularly when some of the logical replacements weren't available for a variety of reasons. If we can keep the nucleus of our best side on the paddock for a full season we will be positively dangerous. And yet in spite of all that we developed a reputation for commitment and courage. Our second round 19-15 win against Souths having come from 15-0 down at half time

typified this but these qualities were exemplified in that magnificent Quarter Final loss to eventual premiers Uni. All who saw that game couldn't help but marvel at the tenacity and heroics of a GPS side who had 3 players carried off, having given their all, in pursuit of a Michael Lynagh denied victory.

Other positive things to emerge from 1990 include the wonderful performances by Anthony Herbert on the NZ tour; the winning of the Club Best and Fairest by Clinton Busteed who really developed an irreplaceable tag in A Grade; the consistently good form of Damien Peppin and David Greene and the unique and unusual, but highly effective, leadership style of mighty mouth Tony "bash'em" Mee! Equally, one couldn't let this opportunity pass without acknowledging the contribution of stalwart prop Lote Tuquiri who, at 42 years of age, came out of semi-retirement to help his Club, in a time of crisis, field a competitive scrum week after week.

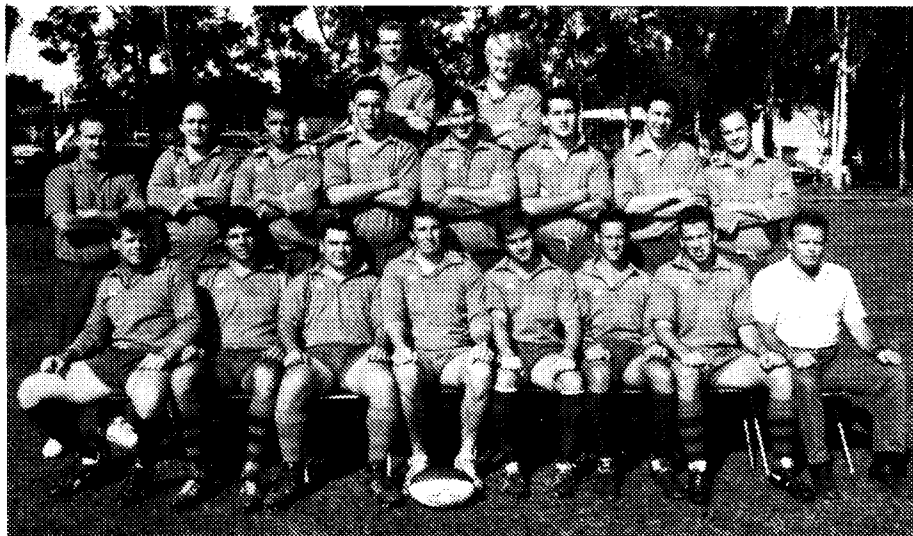

We finished the competition rounds in fifth spot and went into the semi finals having won four games straight. Unfortunately our first semi final appearances would be our last game for the season going down 15-9 to Souths in what amounted to a penalty kicking duel as no tries were scored. It was a sad end to such a good season but that's Rugby.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The Club's financial results for the year ending 30 September 1990 are encouraging and look promising for the next few years.

A bit disappointing this year was the reduction in income from functions and various fundraising activities. All functions were profitable during the year with the exception of the pre-test dinner, the format and timing of this function will need review in the forthcoming year. I would like to point out that the organising and running of functions this year fell back largely on the committee. While other major clubs in Brisbane seem to have an endless stream of people willing to offer assistance, we are always pleading for help. Old Boys and players, where are you? Let's see the committee do the job they were elected for.

On the fund raising side of things, doubles sold at the big games at Ballymore, usually very profitably, fell apart after only a few matches. It was left up to the same few people to carry this for the remainder of the season.

Of particular mention is work performed by Frank Jensen in collecting the subscriptions. Once again it proved difficult in obtaining this reasonable levy from players. It should be noted that the direct cost to the club of fielding each player is \$75. This compares to this year's subscription fee of \$40. I would like to encourage players to pay as soon as possible in the new year and not be carried by other members of the club.

An additional form of income to the club this year was that of commissions and to this end I would like to thank Owen Edwards of Future Guard and National Mutual together with Flight Centre, 360 Queen Street.

On the expenditure side there are a number of items which have been finalised this year and will represent a saving in the forthcoming year. These are:

- Leasing: scrum machine \$2,071.19 is now paid for.
- General expenses \$2,480.90 representing legal fees of a non-recurring nature.

During the year the club made eight repayments of \$1,000 on its interest free loans and it is anticipated that the balance of \$31,000 will be repaid within the next three years.

In conclusion, may I extend to the incoming committee and players every success in the forthcoming year.

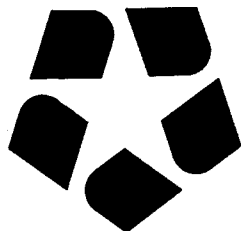

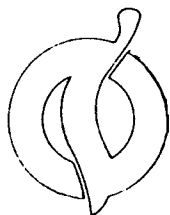
