PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Acknowledgements

I am grateful to have such a dedicated group of people to help with the conduct of the Club. This year we were joined by Ron Cervetto, John Petersen, and Rob King-Scott for the first time and their enthusiasm was evident around the Club during the year. Paul McVerry and Chris Stewart continued on from where they left off in 2001 – behind the bars, cleaning up, carrying stuff and conducting the ever popular Ballymore Bar-B-Q's at Friday night Premier Games. Paul and Jim Barden continued the ongoing joint committee arrangements with the Ashgrove-GPS Club as we are still trying to bed down our commercial relationship. Michael Gleeson and Treasurer Paul Innes were both overwhelmed by work pressures during the year but still managed to contribute to Club Administration. Paul Innes will report that we have now got audited accounts for 1999, 2000 and 2001 and I thank Alan Taylor for assisting with this task. Gerry Barlow kept on keeping on and while many of her efforts went unheralded she was there to do any and all things needed to make things run as smoothly as possible. The GPS Ball kicked the season off very early in the year thanks to Gerry and her band of willing helpers. Ryan Webster was co-opted to the committee and he was a valuable conduit between the Colts players, the Grades Players and the committee.

Finally I would again like to thank Rod Torkington for the hours of thankless effort he has devoted to the Club again this year. I personally cannot thank him enough for being my punching bag on many issues – he certainly deflected many of the hot topics before they got to me.

Andrew Scott started the year with us however he had the opportunity to further his Fitness and Conditioning career in Japan and we wished him well earlier in the year. However we have been fortunate to employ Peter Farden as Scotty's replacement. Peter has approached the Development Officers role with gusto and his enthusiasm and dedication is refreshing.

Sponsorship

This is a hard row to hoe! Norris Motors came back on board at the eleventh hour with a much appreciated funds injection and a vehicle for our Head Coach. The Gap Tavern and Bank of Queensland continued with their arrangements while Tony Mee's Iceworks and Don McGregor's Naturform were on board again with contra help in the Facility Improvements. Bowser and Lever came in with materials that helped finish off the Office/Gym project. Concorde Computers and Rapid Copy supported our IT and publishing needs and The Caxton weighed in with cash and kind for training aids and a couple of good functions at the Hotel.

The Best and Fairest sponsors are always supportive and this year the Bar Builda supporters have assisted to get our Joint Facility to the current stage.

The unpaid sponsors, our Volunteers, provide immeasurable support to the Club – without them we could not function

Finances

It is with pleasure that I note that our Treasurer Paul Innes has been able to report a profit this year, which is just as well as I remind members that we have sold the last tangible piece of the farm and we are now relying on our overdraft facility to see us through the off season. Luckily our funding model with the QRU has changed so that we receive them sooner and more balanced over the full year. It is evident that our major funding from the QRU is all related to Premier Rugby and is much less prescriptive, that is, we get the funds and in most cases we have the discretion on where they are spent as long as we meet certain Premier Rugby standards. A good example of this is that we are no longer required to employ a Development Officer and most Brisbane Clubs will not in 2003. My committee concurs with the view of our predecessors that saw the need for this role in the Club before QRU provided funding two years ago. We will continue to employ a development officer to assist with our Club development and to assist Albany Creek-GPS on its growth path. Hopefully Ashgrove-GPS will accept our offer of some Administrative support so that they can relieve the burden on volunteers.

Facility Development

The General Manager's report goes into this in considerable detail. Suffice to say we have done very well with very little. The new Bar and surrounds, the seating on the main field, the Players Gym, the Office, the storage sheds and the refurbishment of the summer palace are all something we can see as a tangible improvement in our asset at Yoku Road. This is the first real upgrade since Jeeps moved here in the 70's. Our co-tenants, Valleys, have been very supportive and Ashgrove GPS has funded some of the works on the smaller building.

We still haven't top-dressed the ovals or upgraded the lights - maybe next year.

Junior Affiliates

Ashgrove-GPS has joined us in the main clubhouse and while the financial arrangements are still evolving the foundation of a more cooperative arrangement is in place.

Albany Creek-GPS is another successful venture. Their growth has been remarkable and their ability to be self supporting at this early stage is testimony to the support the Club has in the local community. Steve Taylor and his committee are looking forward to another 20% hike in numbers next year.

Representative Football

2002 saw another year of our Club decimated in the early season by representative commitments. We had players in the Wallabies, Australia 'A', Queensland, Brumbies and the Australian Sevens. It was great to see Queensland retrieve Tim Atkinson from Canberra conversely it was disappointing to see them let Andrew Farley go and for us to lose him to Swansea.

GPS prides itself on giving players every opportunity to reach whatever level they aspire to and at the same time reminding them that Rugby is still only a game played for enjoyment and comradeship.

Premier Rugby

The new world -----

With the appointment of the new QRU CEO, Jeff Miller, the urgency to introduce the concept of Premier Rugby as required by the ARU became a primary focus of the Rugby Department and the Brisbane Competition Sub committee. Considerable effort and funding went into introducing and marketing the concept to the Brisbane community.

GPS embraced the product and supported home games with theme days, Presidents lunches, Junior curtain raisers and as much local press coverage as we could. Our team was as strong as last years and our coaching staff the same so we looked forward to a reasonably successful Premier Rugby Season. Unfortunately our coach Steve Meehan was offered the opportunity to coach in France and he accepted with the committee's blessing. The team suffered some early injuries which followed it right through to the knockout final where we were defeated — one spot closer than 2001. Our team still played the entertaining game we have come to expect and patronage grew at every home game right up to the Taylor-Hammond Rugby Fest day against Wests where Wests regained the trophy.

On the Field

2002 was not the best year for the Club, finishing a disappointing 7th in the Doughty Shield. However the mighty Fourths won their premiership in fine styte. A team of incredible contrasts this bunch of larrikins led by their Captain/Coach Scott Lavering capped off a season of no training but a lot of social interaction with a convincing Grand Final win. The Club appreciates the effort that Scott put into fielding a team each week along with his Manager Tony Mahoney.

Marcus Reilly and Tim Conroy coached our First Grade team. This team was raped and pillaged by the Premier Grade all year however they performed credibly under the circumstances. As has occurred over many years our Club has lacked depth of talent and it reflects markedly when a few injuries leave gaps in the top teams. Notwithstanding that the First Grade players were young and enthusiastic – we look forward to seeing some of them in Premier Grade next year.

George Twohill moved up to Second Grade in 2002. He had a difficult year. It seems when the upper end of the Club calls up players this Grade never recovers. Suffice to say if this team had its players at any time during the season they would have fared much better. In spite of on field results George was able to encourage the values of mateship and enjoyment amongst the players who filtered in and out of his team which did much for the overall Club spirit.

Al Smith fared slightly better with Third Grade and this can be attributed to his perseverance and enthusiasm. Al led by example. He is the model for young members to look to when they ask what it means to be a good Clubman.

I can't leave 2nd and 3rd grades without acknowledging the contribution of Graham Rylance, their Manager. The energy displayed by Graham throughout the season defied his age and is an example to all.

Women's Rugby has lost its momentum and GPS had great troubles fielding a team every week. Michelle Binnie and Kate Taylor did everything they could to keep the girls who did turn up as entertained as possible and it's to be hoped that 2003 is a better year.

The Colts teams this year were our least successful in many years. They didn't get a very good run with both Colts 1 coaches moving overseas early in the season. We thank Justin Barlow for stepping into the breach at that point however he was fighting an uphill battle. Kevin Hoare coached Colts 2 with assistance from the Webster brothers. Again a disappointing year where injuries took a debilitating influence over results. Luke Barden did a magnificent job in fielding a team almost every week in Colts 3 however even he had troubles late in the season when the results had gone against us and it was hard to convince the young players to play before the party.

To all those team officials I have missed thank you for your contribution in 2002 and a special thank you to Simon Mammino who managed both Premier and First Grades on his lonesome after Ben McGahan took up a position with the ARU in Sydney at the start of the season.

Y2003

2003 will see a variation to Premier Grade in that the Welsby Cup in the first round will have no significant outcome. Canberra has already been given the OK not to field a team in the Welsby cup and the GPS committee is reviewing its position in respect of this competition. All other Rugby in Brisbane will be called Community or Recreation Rugby with all Clubs able to nominate teams in whatever competition they see fit. It is expected that home games will have all teams at home however away games could mean teams scattered all over the greater Brisbane area and the Gold Coast.

The senior coaching appointments for 2003 have all been made from within despite some high profile applicants from outside the Club. Paul Green has been appointed Coaching Director with an umbrella responsibility for all club coaching and a supervising role with the Premier Grade coaches, Mick Heenan and Marcus Reilly. Both Paul and Mick have been invited into the Level 3 Coaching Program for 2003 which is an indication of the recognition they have in the wider Rugby community.

The Committee was delighted to secure the services of Alex Pope and Steve Calder to co ordinate the Colts coaching for 2003. Alex is a Wallaby and is renowned for his player management skills and his coaching of young adults while Steve comes to us from a Rugby League background as a player, coach and most recently as the Broncos fitness and conditioning coach.

2003 is beginning of the revolution of Club Rugby in Brisbane. It will set us on a path to semi-professionalism by about 2005. GPS along with most Brisbane Clubs is not in a position to sustain a semi-professional Club. We must position ourselves to be ready for this inevitable progression otherwise we will see a Rugby Competition the same as the NRL – all Sydney Clubs with a token representation from Queensland in the form of a franchise or two. GPS has not fostered Queensland Rugby players since the late 1800s to see Queensland Rugby become a branch office of Sydney. I call on all members past and present to support your Club activities in 2003 so our ongoing viability is assured.
