On the subject of making Ashgrove Sports Ground a better place, 2006 and 2007 are shaping up as watershed years in this context. 2006, because that is the year in which our co-tenants Valley Cricket were successful in securing a State Government Major Facilities Sports Grant of up to \$500,000 for a complete reconstruction of the playing surfaces and the implementation of leading edge water capture, storage and re-use systems. 2007, because that is the year (August to December) in which it is planned for the work to take place and in which Cricket and Rugby will need to demonstrate the capacity to match the State Government's \$500.000.

Argentina tour

By the time you read this report, 28 of your fellow GPS members will have departed our shores for a tour of Argentina. This trip has been fully funded by the players who have worked tirelessly under the guidance of a small group of dedicated and very supportive parents. As an example of what can be achieved by a group of motivated people, it is worth noting that Friday night meat trays at the Alderley Arms and Home Game BBQ's together accounted for in excess of \$25,000 of tour revenue. On behalf of the Club, congratulations to the players and thank you to the support group who made this wonderful dream become a reality. We wish you all a safe and enjoyable trip and look forward to seeing you back at the Club in 2007 – except Tim Heenan, 2006 club captain, who is intending to play a year or so in England. Tim will be sorely missed around Yoku Road, but even after a year or two in England, will still be under 30 years of age when he arrives back – an ideal age for a prop and hopefully with his best playing years still ahead of him.

Team Reports

Premier Grade

Premier Grade was consistently placed at the fringes of the top four throughout the 2006 season but was not able to defeat the teams we were competing with for a top four finish. Ultimately the losses to Brothers and Souths in particular proved to be the difference between making the finals and missing out.

There were many highlights, among them the two wins against Wests, with the first a last gasp win at Sylvan Road capped by a magnificent 80m team try eventually scored under the posts by Liam Ferguson, and some fantastic individual efforts, most notably a 70m try by Byron Roberts against Uni which involved a chip kick, regather, stepping through two or three defenders and out pacing the cover defence, and a 50 m try by lock Sean Graham against Norths which showed off his dummy and swerve to full effect.

Special moments were many and it is unfair to highlight any, however the speech given by Michael Ware (on one of his holidays from Iraq) before the Gold Coast game at home was memorable for his insights into the mindset of the typical US Marine.

Congratulations to all of the grades coaches this season who contributed equally to winning the club championship, which is a fantastic achievement, and in particular to Nick Fogarty and Alan Mills for taking third grade to the grand final, and to Scott Lavaring and Tony Mahoney for their premiership success with sixth grade

Finally thanks to the GPS committee for their energetic efforts throughout the year. The massive crowds at the home games against Brothers and Wests were particular highlights for all at the club and would not have happened without a dedicated and proactive Committee.



Season 2005 saw a major turning point for the 3rd grade side after some disappointing seasons in the years previous. 

We would like to thank all players who passed through 4th Grade in 2006 and Drew Vautin and George Bickerstaff for their assistance throughout the season.





We all look forward to next season, with a well-developed Master Plan for on-going facility improvements under way and our targeted skills coaching organized.

I have thoroughly enjoyed my time as president, and look forward to continuing on in a supporting role in the committee. Our club is in a very strong financial position, membership continues to grow such that capacity is becoming a challenge, and support from our membership remains a credit to those people who comprise the local community.

The biggest challenge is maintaining the ideals of sportsmanship that 'Rugby Ethos', both amongst our players <u>and the parents</u>. Fortunately most people are mature and 'sporting' in their approach, however the increased incidence of inappropriate behaviour by parents is a worrying trend. I ask all members to

Treasurer's Report

The year 2006 has again been financially successful for our club. Our net profit of \$44,180 compares well with \$41,290 in 2005 and \$6,821 in 2004.

In a club such as ours, profit is only relevant as a means of keeping us solvent and able to continue providing facilities for the enjoyment of rugby.

Much of the value in our club cannot be adequately quantified, being the combined efforts of the willing band of unpaid (or lowly paid!) helpers, being coaches, managers, committee, canteen, BBQ, fundraising events and field set-up and sundry other tasks.

In addition, numerous benefactors willingly contribute their skills and expertise whenever a project is underway.

I will elaborate on some of the more important issues in relation to our finances.

Player Subscriptions

Players have continued to pay up willingly, resulting in almost 100% success of collection subscriptions. We will attempt to keep any fee increases to a minimum, but must always be aware that we have limited sources of revenue, making subscriptions a vital component.

Canteen Arrangement

Canteen management in 2006 reverted to the two clubs (Seniors and Juniors) maintaining individual responsibility for sales and stock. No system is ever entirely satisfactory and we thank the junior club for their co-operation in dealing with a very crowded management.

QRU Premier Grant

As in previous years, we have received a grant of \$80000 from the QRU to assist in the cost of funding a premier grade side. We are grateful to the QRU for this continued support, but we must also remain mindful that future receipt of this grant is largely out of our hands.

There is talk of gradual reduction or even elimination of this funding as a means to offset the substantial cost of funding the newly established National Competition.

We will continue to lobby the QRU and ARU on the importance of a vibrant, quality club competition and we urge members and supporters to do likewise.

As a Committee it is also important that we recognize the possibility of future funding cuts and seek alternative revenue sources and avenues to reduce expenditure, without unduly compromising the quality of our rugby.

Sponsorship

Sponsorship is vital to our club and we are fortunate to have a group of sponsors who provide financial and other assistance to us.

Norris Motors were again our Principle Sponsor with AWX Labour Hire, Channel 7 and Fastway Couriers as Major Sponsors.

We are also grateful to the QRU for organizing sponsorship from Bartercard and Tooheys.

Other significant sponsors were Bardon Bowls Club, Ashgrove Air (David Stower), The Alderley Hotel and Jones Lang Lasalle.

"Shy" Sponsors

We also have within our club a number of benefactors who quietly demonstrate loyalty through voluntary assistance. They do not seek recognition for their efforts but we know our members appreciate their efforts.

For example, in the past 12 months

- **Brisbane Ice Sales** (The Mee Brothers) have provided ice for Seniors and Juniors at no charge. Even the mobile refrigeration vans have been "freebies." This is a substantial saving, as anyone purchasing even a single bag of ice at the garage will agree.
- Martin Silec of Concrib, and Tony Mahoney of Wilmah Concreting and Gus Porteous of Bowser and Lever lent their time, expertise and materials to construct the extended apron in front of the clubhouse.
- Club stalwart Chris (Jelly) Davies of Hendra Hardware once again provided all the gas for our BBQ s. We've lost count of the number of years Chris has been doing this but it must be at least 10 by now.
- Torko's mate Kerry Keating at Rapid Copy Milton, for the third or fourth year in a row, took
 care of most of our needs for the year with regards to the printed word.
- Michael O'Kelly (Ultimate Builders) who at short notice replaced all fascias after a storm and willingly helps Torko whenever building maintenance is required.

In addition there are many other people who willingly provide expertise whenever asked and it is gratifying for the Committee to be able to call on this goodwill when required.

Please support the businesses that support us.

Home Games

Over the past two seasons we have created an expectation that Jeeps Home Game are <u>events</u>. This has been a deliberate strategy, borne out of a belief that many true Rugby followers enjoy the simple pleasures of good food (lip smacking burgers!), a few drinks and an opportunity to socialize in a picturesque setting while watching entertaining rugby at close quarters.

Numerous newspaper reports during the season made comment on the size of the crowds and the obvious fun to be had down at Yoku Road, before, during and long after the main game.

Home games also continue to be a visible form of support for our sponsors. Each sponsor has a nominated home game at which to invite guests and promote signage.

We also encourage members and supporters to consider hosting events of any size e.g. birthdays, corporate entertainment, old boys reunions, as it is a very enjoyable afternoon and helps create atmosphere at our games.

Events and Functions

We have a number of important fundraising events during the year, including the Pre-Test lunch, the Golf day and the Home Games.

In addition we have smaller functions, such as the annual Dinner, which are not meant to be fundraisers as such, but it is important that we cover costs.

This year we also hosted an evening for the coaches, managers and committee, plus their long-suffering partners. Most of the catering was funded through our Bartercard sponsorship, and we received donations for some wines, but there was still a cost for the evening. The Committee believes this was an important gesture to a great group of people who give freely of their time.

Overall functions contributed approximately \$143 000 in income, with costs of \$93 000, so it is hard earned income.

Pre Test Function

Once again the Pre Test Function was a major contributor to our profit and was a tribute to superb organizational skills and perseverance of Mike Thies.

Golf Day

The 2006 Golf day was again a great social event and fundraiser, with special thanks to Committeeman Greg Geraghty for organizing the event and running the day.

The function afterwards featured one of the most interesting raffles ever seen.

Capital Projects

There is now a visible tribute to the efforts of the Ashgrove GPS Junior Rugby Club, in the contribution of a superb fixed awning outside the Clubhouse. It was still under construction at our end-of-year, but is now complete and will be of major benefit to all users of Yoku Road.

We thank the Junior Club for their perseverance in delivering this project.

As part of this project, we extended the concrete apron and since the end of financial year we have added fencing to the perimeter. An excellent site for post-match activities!

Major Project

At the recent State Elections the Government made a commitment to assist in redevelopment of Yoku Road.

Valley District Cricket Club has been driving the project, with the co-operation of the two Rugby Clubs and we are in the process of developing a master plan for the complex.

The first stage alone will cost \$1 million, with 50% paid by the State Government.

It will greatly enhance the fields and facilities, but it is obviously a significant potential liability looming.

Expenditure

Expenditure overall was \$342,828 for 2006, compared to \$293,068 in 2005. We will continue to monitor expenditure and seek areas in which costs can be reduced without compromising the enjoyment and safety of players, coaches and supporters.

The increased patronage, both at training and at home games, comes at a financial cost, with cost of bin collection and electricity rising sharply over the past two years.

Balance Sheet

Our Balance Sheet is very healthy, and enabled us to assume a small debt this year to purchase a new scrum machine. Debt outstanding in respect of this item at 30 September 2006 was \$ 8,397.

Outlook

Jeeps can look confidently to the future, but we still rely on the efforts of so many volunteers. It is the responsibility of all members to ensure that the load is shared around.

Large numbers of players and large crowds are a welcome sight, but it means more work as well.

Summary

In summary I would like to thank Peter Garbett and the rest of the Committee, plus the many volunteers who have worked so hard to ensure our Clubs financial viability. In particular I would like to thank Rod Torkington, Ellen Godfrey and members of the Finance Sub Committee, Rowan Sedgwick, Dave Howard, Jim Graham and Andrew Fielding for their support over the past 12 months.

We are faced with major financial challenges in the next few years, but when has it ever been any different? I am confident that the progression made over the past few years will help us negotiate any trouble spots ahead.

NOTE 1: Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Queensland. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Queensland and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AAS 3 Accounting for Income Tax

AAS 5 Materiality

AAS 8 Events Occurring After Reporting Date

AAS 17 Accounting for Leases

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report is prepared, on a cash basis whereby items are brought into account as money is paid or received, from the records of the association.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Fixed Assets

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity and that this special purpose financial report should be prepared in accordance with the accounting policies outlined in Note 1 to the financial statements.

In the opinion of the committee the financial report as set out on pages 1 to 5:

- 1. Presents fairly the financial position of GPS Old Boys Rugby Union Club Inc. as at 30 September 2006 and its performance for the year ended on that date.
- 2. At the date of this statement, there are reasonable grounds to believe that GPS Old Boys Rugby Union Club Inc. will be able to pay its debts as and when they fall due.

Scope

We have audited the financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of GPS Old Boys Rugby Union Club Inc. for the year ended 30 September 2006 as set out on pages 1 to 5. The committee is responsible for the financial report and has determined that the accounting policies used and described in Note 1 to the financial statements which form part of the financial report, are appropriate to meet the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Queensland and are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. We have conducted an independent audit of this financial report in order to express and opinion on it to the members of GPS Old Boys Rugby Union Club Inc. No opinion is expressed as to whether the accounting policies used are appropriate to the needs of the members.

Our procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report and the evaluation of significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion whether, in all material respects, the financial report is presented fairly in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 so as to present a view which is consistent with our understanding of the Association's financial position, and performance as represented by the results of its operations and its cash flows. These policies do not require the application of all Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements in Australia.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

Audit Opinion

In our opinion, the financial report presents fairly subject to the following qualification in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements, the financial position of GPS Old Boys Rugby Union Club Inc. as at 30 September 2006 and the results of its operations for the year then ended.

Due to the nature of the income of GPS Old Boys Rugby Union Club Inc. and the limited resources available to the association to implement adequate internal controls over areas such as cash income it is impracticable to verify that all funds due to the Association were received however we have no reason to believe that all monies of the Association were not received and banked.
