## GPS Rugby Brief History

GPS Rugby is the successor in name to GPS Old Boys Rugby Club and to the Past Grammar School Football Club and it is the oldest surviving Rugby Club in Queensland and one of the oldest Rugby Clubs in Australia. The Club was officially formed in 1887 and consisted of a combination of both past and present Brisbane Grammar School players although a number of them represented Queensland as Past Grammar players in 1885 and 1886.

In 1889 the Past Grammar School Football Club was established as a separate identity distinct from the old side with its mix of past and present players. The Club was formalised at a meeting held on the 5<sup>th</sup> March 1891 and Mr. R.H. Roe, the Headmaster of Brisbane Grammar School was elected as President. Sir Charles Lilley and Sir Samuel Griffith, among others, were elected as Vice Presidents. It was decided that the Club colours would be red and white. Rugby was not played in Queensland from 1916 until reintroduced in 1928 when, under a new name, the BGS Old Boys' Rugby Union Football Club again took its place in the Brisbane competition.

In 1930 the constitution of the Club was changed to allow past students from the other GPS schools to become members and although the name was retained that year it was later changed to GPS Old Boys' Rugby Club and it played in green and blue colours for the first time in the 1931 season. Later the constitution was again changed and membership of the club made unrestricted.

Fifty of the Club's members have played for Australia and over 200 have played for Queensland. Seven have captained Australian senior teams, two the Australian sevens team and one has represented and captained England and another Scotland.

Ashgrove GPS Junior Rugby Club was formed from the Ashgrove Emus Club in 1984 when it affiliated with GPS Old Boys after that club moved from Finsbury Park to Ashgrove Sports Ground. It quickly grew to be the largest Junior Club in Brisbane winning the QJRU President's trophy for the most successful club on a number of occasions.

In 2014 GPS Old Boys Rugby Club amalgamated with Ashgrove GPS Junior Rugby Club to form GPS Rugby Club making it the largest club in Australia with almost 1500 players. In 2018 the Amalgamated club won its first premiership and in 2019 won the Australian Club Championship.

The Club can certainly build on this going into 2021. We finished 5th in the Doughty Shield for overall club performance down from 4<sup>th</sup> in 2019. The measure of success in Brisbane Rugby is where we finish in the Doughty Shield being the measure of overall club performance, we last won the shield in 2008. We this in mind the Club the Club appointed Stephen Meehan as our Director of Rugby for 2021. The Club is fortunate to be able to draw on Stephen's experience that he has established with experts in the fields of coaching, performance and leadership around the world. I would also like to thank Elwee Prinsloo for his contribution to the club over the last four years and wish him well in the future.

Our juniors fielded some 54 teams in 2020 with some 824 players.

The club after much consideration will be introducing "The GPS Rugby Scholarship" for 2021. The scholarship is designed to support outstanding new and continuing players 18 to 20 who have demonstrated exceptional ability in rugby to combine a tertiary/trade education with high performance sport. There will be up to five Scholarships of \$4,000 p.a. awarded based on the yearly available funding.

I'd like to thank all coaching Staff from seniors to juniors for the hard work here to make the season an enjoyable one for all. It is important that we as a club deliver a consistent and well planned out program of skills development.

#### Finances

The club continues to be run in a fiscally responsible manner and from the Financial report we remain in a sound financial position. With Covid 19, revenue certainly took a hit. Expenses for 2020 were managed tightly and was supported with Government Assistance in the form of Job Keeper; Cashflow boost for Non for Profit and various State and Local government assistance. The Club needs to be very mindful of the environment we enter for 2021. Capital Improvements at the club are always best managed with the assistance of government grants requiring generally only a 20% contribution from the club. The cash reserves of the club continue to be used to ensure the facilities are maintained and over time brought up to date.

It is appropriate that the Club acknowledges the bequest to the club of \$100,000 from the late Bob Armstrong. Bob played for GPS between 1970 and 1979 playing 148 games including 68 First Grade. He scored 18 tries. in 1975 he served on the Committee and has been a regular supporter of GPS from the sidelines for many years. These funds will be set aside and used to fund the GPS Rugby Scholarship. We believe it is appropriate name the individual GPS Rugby Scholarships in honour of those bequeathing funds to the Club moving forward.

#### Volunteers

A club of our size relies heavily on the volunteers which makes it the successful community club that it is. A very special thanks to those who gave up their time this year. The support from volunteers with coaching, managing, assisting with ground set up, working behind the canteen or bar and assisting with functions and events has contributed to a successful season.

### Facilities

## Rugby Report

### Introduction

GPS fielded 8 senior teams in 2020 of which we had 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and ladies' teams competing in the final's series. Both 4<sup>th</sup> grade and ladies advanced through to their respective grand finals with our 4<sup>th</sup> grade team winning a premiership in great fashion against a tough Brothers team.

COVID meant a shortened competition but a very long preparation period which was a challenge in itself but it was excellent to see how the players and coaches dealt with this throughout the season.

### Seniors

We commenced our preseason preparation during November 2019 with a largely changed group in Premier grade due to the retirements of players like Cam King and Dan Gorman but also the promotion of some of our regular Premier players to Super rugby programs at both the Reds and Rebels. The Colts and Senior program were very much aligned in principles and general S&C preparation and we had the greatest number of Colts included in the senior program for years.

Recruitment was a key focus, and we were able to secure some X factor in the off season and those new boys did a fantastic job settling into the GPS way. The players and staff did a great job in preparing the teams for the start of the competition in March and as we all know COVID hit.

From here on we committed as a group to keep developing and stay in top condition as it was very unclear as to when everything was going to kick off again. This period went from 3 weeks to 3 months and looking back at it now I could not be prouder of the group on how they have applied themselves throughout this period.

We implemented a very position specific program in terms of athletic development but also 1v1 skills that later evolved to small group skills until we got back in full swing. Players were also split into social groups for team dinners and training with themes to ensure we took advantage of the down time and get to know each other better. Zoom calls and team challenges were a weekly occurrence and something the boys really enjoyed.

When it became time to return to full training we were presented with not only the obvious COVID challenges but also with a draw that meant we would play 5 of our 8 games away from home as well as losing our training facility to cricket.

For the initial part it was very much business as usual in terms of training and games and all grades kicked off the trials with a bang. We started the competition playing for points against Brothers, Easts, Sunnybank and University of Queensland of whom there was 3 out of the previous year's top 4. The boys started off well but the lack of depth in front row was quickly evident due the loss of Jethro to the Reds on a short-term cover and injuries to Fred Burke. Of course, this provided opportunity for young players such as Emosi Tuqiri and John Downes to step in and fill some big shoes which they have done a great job of. We obviously started off with 2 wins and 2 very narrow losses against the 2 finalists at the end which certainly added a bit of extra pressure to get outcomes on the road in the last 4 games. It was certainly a challenge to find cohesion as a Prems and Reserve grade squad due to some of these tests but I was very proud of how the boys stuck to it and again made the top for the 4 consecutive year.

Grades was very much influenced by COVID in terms of playing numbers returning post July. The changing of training venues meant some teams were based at Ballymore and some teams at Everton park certainly challenged us in terms of alignment, preparation and general operations comparing to our normal situation when everyone were based at the club.

All grades coaches did an excellent job and the recruitment skills of Ryan Freney coaching in his 1<sup>st</sup> year paid off in the end with a great premiership. The ladies' team was another special story with Denzlle Moors joining us from Brothers and certainly changing things to a real performance culture. Their progress was evident in the grand final with some outstanding rugby being played despite going to down with only 2 points.

Overall, the group dealt with these challenges in a very brave way and everyone could be proud of what they have delivered. Some special moments included

- The involvement of Will Genia and Samu Kerevi
- Making the top 4 for a 4<sup>th</sup> consecutive year

As per the seniors the junior program was also very influenced by COVID but we were all lucky enough at the end to play some rugby and see some great progress of some of our players, coaches and the program as a whole. As per previous year we started coaching development with a coaching symposium where we had another great attendance and quality presenters that offered insight into the technical parts of the modern game.

We followed this up with age group specific coaching development nights discussing new concepts, training content and future changes to improve the program. Part of this was more alignment and we certainly made some progress in this regard with the design of all session content for junior coaches but also making available additional resources such as training videos for their use throughout the season. This year also allowed us with an unique opportunity to restructure our 6's and 7's program to include development skills such as tackle introduction and break-down work to ensure our boys had some level of exposure prior to 8's when this became part of the rules. Our senior player involvement was as strong as ever and our specialist sessions seemed very popular especially when we got Samu Kerevi to deliver on one of these components.

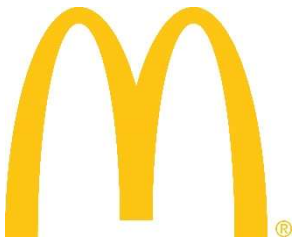

### Financial Report

Well what a very interesting and challenging year 2020 turned out to be. Congratulations to the Women and 4<sup>th</sup> Grade for an outstanding effort at the Grand Final. From a financial point of view, it has been a mixed year for the club with overall income and expenditure down around 27% due to the implications of COVID-19, however, it should be noted that GPS Rugby Club produced an excess of expenditure over income of approximately \$59,000

The following items form the primary income drivers for the club:

- Playing Fees & Memberships \$245k (10% decrease from 2019)
- Sponsorship \$284k (29% decrease from 2019)
- Canteen & Merchandise \$321k (31% decrease from 2019)
- Functions & Fundraising \$98k (55% decrease from 2019)
- Government Grants \$22k
- ATO Jobkeeper \$78k

Our Sponsorship continues to be a strong contributor to income, and we are very fortunate to have continued great support from our local businesses and generous sponsors. Functions/events was substantially lower than last year as we were unable to host events on the fields due to the Government Regulations and restrictions in place during COVID-19 lockdown period. Merchandise sales have remained strong in 2020.

The operational expenses of the club are being well controlled and were being closely watched particularly this year.

I would like to thank our staff, club members, club committee members and all our volunteers for their continued support and help throughout the year. In particular, a special mention to Anthony Herbert for his contribution to club and canteen operations.

Whilst our income from sponsorship, membership, trading has been solid and consistent for a period of a few years, these income flows should never be taken for granted as they can change significantly and quickly like what happened in 2020. The club continues to maintain tight control over cash reserves.

2020 was certainly a different year but I look forward to being part of a very successful Rugby Club in 2021.





# Notes to the Financial Statements

## GPS Rugby Club Inc

For the year ended 31 October 2020

### 1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act of Queensland. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

#### Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

#### Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

#### Employee Provisions

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee provisions have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

#### Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

#### Cash on Hand

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

#### Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

#### Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

### **Leases**

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset (but not the legal ownership) are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

### **Goods and Services Tax (GST)**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

### **Financial Assets**

Investments in financial assets are initially recognised at cost, which includes transaction costs, and are subsequently measured at fair value, which is equivalent to their market bid price at the end of the reporting period. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.

### **Accounts Payable and Other Payables**

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.
